Sanders: 'I am getting a very good feeling about Iowa'

COUNCIL BLUFFS, Ia. — Sen. Bernie Sanders said he's got a "very good feeling about Iowa."

"Since we began this campaign we have spoken to over 31,000 people in the state of Iowa," Sanders told a crowd of about 1,500 at Iowa Western Community College Tuesday evening. "So keep it a secret, don't tell anybody. But I think we're going to win here and we're going to make history."

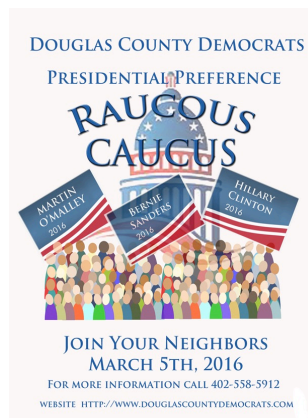

March 5, 2016 Caucus

Mark Saturday March 5th on your calendar, it is the Douglas County Presidential Preference Caucus. Since 2008 Nebraska Democrats have chosen their Presidential Candidate Preference by the Caucus process rather than the primary elections held later in the spring. Anyone who is eligible to vote in Douglas County and will be at least 18 years old on Election Day November 8, 2016, may participate in the Douglas County Caucuses on March 5, 2016.

You must be registered as a Democrat or you can register as a Democrat at the Caucus.
